Over a half million Sandhill cranes converge here every year on their way north, the same location where nearly a half million immigrants converged over 100 years ago on their way west.

Begin your day with a tour of the Archway followed by a live reenactment from the Great Platte River Road. Then watch a video about sandhill cranes before leaving on your school bus to historic Fort Kearny, known as the guardian of the plains. Along the way an Audubon trained guide will discuss the annual crane migration along the Platte River while students view the cranes in the field.
